THE MADISON MUSEUM OF CONTEMPORARY ART AND MILWAUKEE-BASED GUEST CURATOR FATIMA LASTER ANNOUNCE THE 2022 WISCONSIN TRIENNIAL ARISTS

Guest Curator Fatima Laster has selected 23 artists for Ain't I A Woman? MADISON, WI— The Madison Museum of Contemporary Art (MMoCA) and Fatima Laster, Guest Curator, are pleased to announce the artists selected for inclusion in the 2022 Wisconsin Triennial, *Ain't I A Woman?*. Organized by Laster—owner, operator, and curator of 5 Points Art Gallery + Studios in Milwaukee—the exhibition explores the intersection of race and gender as well as the underrepresentation of Black women artists in Wisconsin.

The Wisconsin Triennial will be on view April 23, 2022-Oct. 9, 2022

The Wisconsin Triennial has been known as a celebration of the breadth and range of artistic practices in the state. *Ain't I A Woman?* highlights Black women artists in Wisconsin who expand upon the nature and scope of art production. The exhibition will highlight an intergenerational group of women working across different disciplines, including murals, printmaking, sculpture, painting, performance, textiles, and more.

The theme of the 2022 Wisconsin Triennial, Laster explained, is influenced by abolitionist and women's rights advocate Sojourner Truth's quote and author bell hooks' book on Black feminism, entitled Ain't I A Woman? Laster's exhibition draws much needed attention to the fact that most racial and gender-based equity and inclusion opportunities in the arts have been dominated by Black men and white women to the exclusion of Black women. Ain't I a Woman? expands the discourse and highlights trailblazing women and their work. Featured artists include:

Participating artist Emily Leach—a semi-finalist for the Forward Art Prize for visual artists in Dane County in 2019 and 2020—stated, "I believe that *Ain't I A Woman?* is a historic occasion for MMoCA, and I am so excited and



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honored to be a part of this transformative exhibition. Collectively, I believe we illustrate the irreducibility and urgency of Black radical imagination."

Speaking to the powerful inspiration for Laster's exhibition concept, artist Chrystal Denise Gillon said, "Ain't I A Woman? has been a most challenging exhibition for me, in my journey as an artist and as a person. For me, it's not been just an exhibition 'creating art' around a theme, but an exhibition that has caused deep soul-searching of my thoughts, feelings, experiences, challenges, and opportunities in attempting to articulate the many complexities of what it means to be a woman; in honesty, it is a topic that leaves me feeling vulnerable and exposed."

Ain't I A Woman? will be presented in the Museum's State Street Gallery, Lobby, and The Shop, and be accompanied by robust educational programming throughout the run of the exhibition organized by Charlotte Cummins, Director of Education and Programs, and an Opening Celebration on April 23, 2022, from 5-8 PM coordinated by Annik Dupaty, Director of Events and Volunteers.

The Madison Museum of Contemporary Art offers free gallery admission.
